

Early last year, thousands of volunteers helped the Ramblers (Britain's largest walking charity), to identify lost rights of way. They found that over 49,000 miles of historic paths enough to stretch around the world nearly twice - are missing from official maps in England and Wales. In Gloucestershire alone, there are 910 miles of potential lost paths!

These paths are a vital part of our heritage, describing how people have travelled over the centuries within their communities and beyond, yet if they are not claimed for inclusion on the definitive map (the legal record of rights of way) by January 2026, we risk losing them forever. At a time when more than ever, we recognise the importance of being able to easily access green space and connect with nature, it is

vital that we create better walking routes to enable everyone to explore the countryside on foot.

The Ramblers would love people in Tidenham (and beyond!) to join their team of dedicated volunteers, researching historic evidence and submitting applications to local authorities ahead of the 2026 deadline, to get the most useful paths restored to the map. Having the support of local people with their knowledge of the history of their communities will be vital to helping reclaim these paths so they can be used and enjoyed for

A detailed map of the potential lost paths identified is available on the Ramblers website and members of the public can now suggest priorities for the paths to help understand which may be most beneficial. The ramblers are developing a suite of resources and tools to support volunteers in putting these paths back on the map. Litter Pick

A record 27 adults & children turned up for the Sedbury community litter pick on a summer morning. The rain held off but it was very warm!

3 groups formed with Scouts heading for the Wye Valley Greenway and adjacent playing fields. Everyone else split into 2 groups to walk the Offa's Dyke Path to its junction with Sedbury Lane & in an opposite direction to Tutshill & playing fields. Surrounding roads were covered on the return to Wyedean School.

Once condensed, we collected a total of 4 orange bags of general litter, 2 purple bags of plastic/tins and 2 glass bags & not forgetting a broken school chair - seat only! All litter was removed from site & recycled.

This event was organised as part of the 'Tidenham Parish ECO-Project' with help from Transition Chepstow, Sedbury Space, 1st Sedbury & Tidenham Scout Group, Wyedean School, & WyeValley Greenway volunteers.

Our 'Keep Chepstow Tidy' group runs regular community litter picks and the recent 'Plastic Free Chepstow' initiative organised multiple projects to help reduce our local reliance on single use plastics.



I was ordained a Church of England priest in June 2021 after 4 years of intensive training, both in college and in local parishes.



Dog Waste and Litter



Parish Council spent £13,000 during the last financial year on the

clearing and collection of litter and dog waste in the Parish - not including the purchase of new and replacement bins?

Litter is collected from bins owned by the Parish Council on its own land which is also cleared weekly by a contractor.

The Council owns, installs and empties the dog waste bins on land owned by the Gloucestershire Highways. Last year the cost to Tidenham Parish Council of emptying these alone was almost £6000! These bins are emptied at least

weekly. Over the last year or so the use of these bins has increased hugely and our contractors have reported the waste from some bins can weigh over 20kgs.

Thank you to all of you who pick up your dog waste but.....please don't leave bags of waste on the ground or hanging in trees - and if the waste bin happens to be full PLEASE TAKE THE WASTE HOME WITH YOU. Dog waste can be put in your black home waste bins.

Thank you for your help with this.



GDASS (Gloucestershire Domestic Abuse Support Service)

GDASS is a county-wide support service designed to reduce the level of domestic abuse in our communities and improve the safety of victims and their families.

GDASS support anyone over the age of 16 who are, or who have, experienced domestic abuse.

Domestic abuse can be:

- Physical
- Sexual
- **Psychological**
- **Emotional**
- Economic

This includes those so-called 'honour-based' crimes.

We are proud to support the LGBTQ+ communities and provide specialist support to those within the LGBTQ+ community who are experiencing domestic abuse.

We offer a range of bespoke packages of support to support people to move on from domestic abuse. These are tailored around you and the support needs you have identified for you and your family.

GDASS offer floating support, group work, support for those identified as being at high risk of harm, young people, and specialist support for those engaged with the family courts.

We work very closely with our partner agencies (including statutory services) to help provide holistic, person-centred support, including support through the criminal and civil justice systems.
